- 1 Durable rubberized ground cover will increase safety and decrease maintenance costs.
- 2 The DMCS bus fleet has five Blue Bird TC2000 buses. As of 2009, our buses range from 10-15 years old (with mileages from 103,000 to 129,000.) All the buses have more than 100,000 miles. The bus bodies are showing more rust, and we have experienced several break-downs on out-of-town trips within the last few years. Our goal is to purchase a more reliable bus to transport our students on out-of-town trips.
- 3 Mobile computer carts will allow more flexibility in providing integrated technology into all classrooms (while saving space and cost).
- 4 The Secondary Media Center has been on a multi-year improvement plan since our previous ACSI Accreditation visit. The phased plan provides time for the Media Specialist to order, catalog, and implement the required purchases.
- 5 The stairs are currently unfinished concrete. Epoxy will improve the appearance and the ease of cleaning the stairwells.
- 6 Replace use of extension cords by running underground wiring to power the scoreboard, as well as to the batting cage and home dugout to power the pitching machine in the cage and on the pitching mound.
